MATTEO CAGNASSO, Ph.D.

He graduated in Agricultural Biotechnology at the Faculty of Biotechnology at the University of Turin, with a thesis on "Strategies for obtaining transgenic plants resistant to the bacterium *Erwinia amylovora*."

He graduated with honors in Agricultural and Plants Biotechnology at the Faculty of Agriculture of the University of Turin, with the thesis: "Identification of truffle *Tuber magnatum* genotypes in soil", carried out at the Institute of Plant Protection (IPP), at the CNR and the Faculty of Biology of the University of Turin.

He received his Ph.D. in "Agriculture, Forestry and Food Sciences" at the Department of Valorization and Protection of Agricultural and Forestry Resources (Di.Va.P.R.A.) of the University of Turin, with the thesis: "ATR-FTIR Studies of Phospholipid Vesicle Interactions with α -FeOOH and α -Fe $_2$ O $_3$ Surfaces", curried out at the University of Arizona, SWES Department. The results led to the publication of a first name article [Cagnasso *et al.*, 2010, Colloids and Surfaces: Biointerfaces, 76 (2) 456-467].

The experimental theses of graduate and doctoral research are in the fields of metagenomics and biogeochemistry, falling within the field of environmental research.

He started a second degree in law, to be applied in the fields of law related to biological sciences (industrial law, environmental law, food law, medical and health law, pharmaceutical law). After consulting activities in industrial law held at the studio Saglietti of Turin, in 2011/2012, in 2013 conducts research and consulting at the law firm Cagnasso & Associati in Turin. In 2015 he founded the network YALBA.

The principal activities include research in law and counseling, participation in arbitration, foreign relations and technology transfer operations abroad.

He participated to the 13th Preparation Course for Patent Consultants in 2011/12, and to the 8th Preparatory Course for Trademarks Consultants, organized by Convey Intellectual Property in Turin.
